Holy Synod concludes autumn session

DETROIT, MI – The Holy Synod of Bishops of the Orthodox Church in America held its autumn session at Saint Andrew House here October 19-23, 2015. His Beatitude, Metropolitan Tikhon, presided at the sessions.



In his report, Metropolitan Tikhon shared his draft of "The Apostolic Work of the Church: Building the House of the Lord in Our Lands," which will provide a "guiding framework for the Orthodox Church in America" for this triennium and beyond. Using the image of the four pillars of the altar table, he related how the OCA must build its ministry on the "the foundation, which is Christ," and the pillars of spiritual life – stewardship, evangelism and outreach and external relations.

Among the decisions and actions taken by the hierarchs were the following.

• After the conclusion of a Church Court, the hierarchs canonically deposed the retired Archbishop Seraphim from the status and all sacred functions of the episcopacy, removed him from the ranks of the clergy, and returned him to the status of a lay monk.

• In conjunction with the new *Statute of the Orthodox Church in America,* which becomes effective November 1, 2015, general procedural standards for the use and application in Church Courts were adopted.

• Mission Planting Grants for 2016 were awarded to Saint Katherine Mission, Cardiff, CA; Saint John the Evangelist Mission, Tempe, AZ; Saint James Mission, Beaufort, SC; Saint Nektarios Mission, Waxahachie, TX; and Saint Juvenaly and His Companion Mission, Wasilla, AK.

• The text of a "Service of Prayer after a Miscarriage or Stillbirth" was approved and is available for downloading at *https://oca.org/PDF/Music/Supplemental/service-after-miscarriage.pdf.*

• A resource dealing with end-of-life issues, titled "A Gift for My Loved Ones," was reviewed and approved. It will be available soon on-line for downloading.

OCA releases Assembly of Bishops Position Paper

SYOSSET, NY – The Holy Synod of Bishops released the text of a Position Paper delivered at the sixth annual meeting of the Assembly of Canonical Orthodox Bishops of the USA in Chicago in September 2015. The text was reviewed during the Holy Synod's autumn session.

"We believe that the three proposals of the Canonical and Regional Planning Committee would be best undertaken in the context of an Assembly of Bishops that is worshipping together at the Eucharist and is working provisionally as a Holy Synod of Bishops," the position paper reads. "Addressing differences in pastoral practices, considering new models for restructuring our dioceses on a canonical basis and integrating the work of our ministries and departments will take place most effectively and organically when we are a Synod meeting together and praying together on a much more regular basis. This is the way of the Church."

OCA receives "clean" audit opinion for 2014

SYOSSET, NY – In the independent audit of the Orthodox Church in America's financial records for 2014, the auditors, CapinCrouse LLP, "once again issued an unqualified or 'clean' audit opinion," said Melanie Ringa, OCA Treasurer. "The unqualified opinion is the best type of report an auditee can receive from the external auditor."

"The financial results for 2014 show total operating revenues of \$2,380,032, with \$2,348,760 in total operating expenses," she added.
