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#### The Commemoration of the Holy Fathers of the First Six Ecumenical Councils:

The Sunday of the Fathers of the First Six Councils is a feast held on the Sunday falling from July 13<sup>th</sup> to 19<sup>th</sup>. The Orthodox Church acknowledges Seven Holy Ecumenical Councils. The fact that the Seventh Ecumenical Council (Nicea II) is not commemorated today testifies to the antiquity of today's celebration.

At times in church history, councils of all of the bishops in the church were called. All the bishops were not able to attend these councils, of course, and not all such councils were automatically approved and accepted by the Church in its Holy Tradition. In the Orthodox Church only seven such councils, some of which were actually quite small in terms of the number of bishops attending, have received the universal approval of the entire Church in all times and places. These councils have been termed the Seven Ecumenical Councils.

The dogmatic definitions (dogma means official teaching) and the canon laws of the ecumenical councils are understood to be inspired by God and to be expressive of His will for men. Thus, they are essential sources of Orthodox Christian doctrine.

1. Nicea 1, year 325:

Formulated the First Part of the Creed, defining the divinity of the Son of God.

2. Constantinople I, year 381:

Formulated the Second Part of the Creed, defining the divinity of the Holy Spirit.

3. Ephesus, year 431:

Defined Christ as the Incarnate Word of God and Mary as Theotokos.

4. Chalcedon, year 451:

Defined Christ as Perfect God and Perfect Man in One Person.

5. Constantinople II, year 553:

Reconfirmed the Doctrines of the Trinity and of Christ.

6. Constantinople III, year 680:

Affirmed the True Humanity of Jesus by insisting upon the reality of His human will and action.

7. Nicea II, year 787: (not commemorated today)

Affirmed the propriety of icons as genuine expressions of the Christian Faith.

The preaching of the Apostles and the dog-mas of the Fathers sealed the one Faith of the Church; and clad in the garment of truth woven of theology from on high, it teaches aright and glorifies the great mystery of piety.
