Epistle: 2 Corinthians 6:1-10

Brethren, working together with him, then, we entreat you not to accept the grace of God in vain. For he says, "At the acceptable time I have listened to you, and helped you on the day of salvation." Behold, now is the acceptable time; behold, now is the day of salvation. We put no obstacle in any one's way, so that no fault may be found with our ministry, but as servants of God we commend ourselves in every way: through great endurance, in afflictions, hardships, calamities, beatings, imprisonments, tumults, labors, watching, hunger; by purity, knowledge, forbearance, kindness, the Holy Spirit, genuine love, truthful speech, and the power of God; with the weapons of righteousness for the right hand and for the left; in honor and dishonor, in ill repute and good repute. We are treated as impostors, and yet are true; as unknown, and yet well known; as dying, and behold we live; as punished, and yet not killed; as sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, and yet possessing everything.

St. Tikhon: Hebrews 7:26-8:2

Brethren, it was fitting that we should have such a High Priest, who is holy, harmless, undefiled, separate from sinners, and has become higher than the heavens; who does not need daily, as those high priests, to offer up sacrifices, first for His own sins and then for the people's, for this He did once for all when He offered up Himself. For the law appoints as high priests men who have weakness, but the word of the oath, which came after the law, appoints the Son who has been perfected forever. Now this is the main point of the things we are saying: We have such a High Priest, who is seated at the right hand of the throne of the Majesty in the heavens, a Minister of the sanctuary and of the true tabernacle which the Lord erected, and not man.

But a hireling, he who is not the shepherd, one who does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and flees; and the wolf catches the sheep and scatters them. The hireling flees because he is a hireling and does not care about the sheep. I am the good shepherd; and I know My sheep, and am known by My own. As the Father knows Me, even so I know the Father; and I lay down My life for the sheep. Glorification of St Tikhon, the Apostle to America



St Tikhon, Patriarch of Moscow and Apostle to America was born as Vasily Ivanovich Belavin on January 19, 1865 into the family of Ioann Belavin, a rural priest of the Toropetz district of the Pskov diocese. His childhood and adolescence were spent in the village in direct contact with peasants and their labor. From his early years he displayed a particular religious disposition, love for the Church as well as rare meekness and humility.

When Vasily was still a boy, his father had a revelation about each of his children. One night, when he and his three sons slept in the hayloft, he suddenly woke up and roused them. He had seen his dead mother in a dream, who foretold to him his imminent

death, and the fate of his three sons. She said that one would be unfortunate throughout his entire life, another would die young, while the third, Vasily, would be a great man. The prophecy of the dead woman proved to be entirely accurate in regard to all three brothers.

In Memoriam: Hieromonk Alexander [Mayba]

Hieromonk Alexander [Mayba], 84, for many years a beloved member of the Brotherhood of Saint Tikhon's Monastery, fell asleep in the Lord at Wayne Memorial Hospice on Wednesday, October 5, 2016.

Born in Troy, NY on May 10, 1932, Father Alexander received monastic tonsure on April 7, 1995. On February 18 of the following year, he was ordained to the diaconate, while his ordination to the priesthood occurred on May 20, 1999. In addition to his duties at the monastery, he served the faithful of Saints Peter and Paul Church, Uniondale, PA. In 2004, he was awarded the gold cross by the Holy Synod of Bishops of the Orthodox Church in America.

A Panikhida will be celebrated in the Monastery Church of Saint Tikhon of Zadonsk at 7:00 p.m. on Friday, October 7. His Beatitude, Metropolitan Tikhon will preside at the Hours, Divine Liturgy and Funeral Service for a Priest at 7:40 a.m. on Saturday, October 8, with interment in Saint Tikhon's Monastery Cemetery. A luncheon will follow in the monastery dining hall.

Prayers by the Laker, St. Velimirovich, LXXVII:



At noon the children gather at the lake, to bathe in the sun and the water. O Lord, how the whole of nature marvels at innocence! Strained and pained laborers in the presence of sinners -- the lake and the sun are transfigured in the presence of children. What a magnificent temple of the Lord the lake becomes, when children are in it, and what an inspired high priest the sun becomes, when its rays cross the rays of children's souls.

"Let the children come to me," whispers the whole of nature, "and you will understand that I myself am also a child. To the soulless I seem to be soulless, to saints I am an altar. Whoever seeks the beast in me, will be sent a beast; whoever seeks God in

me, will be shown God. Sinners call me a slaughterhouse, the righteous call me a sacrificial altar. Only to innocence do I manifest myself as innocence, and only to children of God do I reveal myself as a child of God."

"Let the children come to Me," exclaims the Son of the Virgin, and only children come to Him. Those who prevent children from coming to the Son of God, will be liable to the fires of hell. For neither do they themselves come to Him nor do they allow others to come to Him.

"Why children, O Lord, why do You seek children?" those who are made and not born ask the One who was begotten and not made. Such people are made and not born, like statues of stone, and they are moved by the winds of the world. But the One who is begotten and not made moves with life within, and the winds of the world flee from Him.

"Because I Myself am also a child, for this reason I seek children. Impostors see an impostor in Me, atheists see an atheist, and those in authority see in Me one who usurps authority. The Pharisees ask 'Who is this man?' and they cannot resolve the question, while the wise of this world pursue Me into their own worldly wisdom.

"Only children recognize Me, for I too am a child. As a child I am not My own, and as a child I do not seek glory for Myself. As a child I do not think anything on My own, I do not speak anything on My own, and I do not do anything on My own. Instead, like a child, I think what My Father taught

Me, and I speak what I hear, and I do what I see.

"Children cease to be children, but I never cease being a child. Children cease to be children because of their wicked guides, who prevent them from continuing to sojourn with Me and teach them the time-worn wisdom of the world. But I do not cease to be a child, because I nourish Myself with the eternally youthful wisdom of heaven.

"Blessed are those who in old age rid themselves of their wicked guides and the wisdom of those guides, which makes one old, sick, and dead. Whoever turns to Me, even if he has been made old by the world, I shall make him a child and as an eternal child he will reign in My kingdom, to which the elders of the world have no access.

"I tell you that My kingdom is a kingdom of children.

"Truly, those who are made will not see the light of the Kingdom of God, but only those who are begotten. Whatever is Mine, whatever is as I am, this will be with Me.

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"The statues of stone, which the winds of the world move, will be smashed, and their dust will be the sport of winds. But the children, who move with life within, will enter into eternal life."

O Resplendent Lord, Eternal Child of the Holy Triad, help me with Your innocence, the greatest strength in all realms, to be born of the Holy Spirit.

May I not be like a stone statue, made by this world, to be smashed and scattered into the wind. May I rather be like a born youth, inseparable from You in eternity, O Prince of Innocence and of all innocents.

Arrogance When clergy become arrogant

There are some clergy who hide their insecurities and flaws by acting in an arrogant and condescending manner toward those who are under their spiritual care. Being domineering, and thinking themselves privileged, they become condescending toward those they consider lesser then themselves. Rather than serving in the role of a loving

father to their parishioners, they act as though they are entitled to special honor and privilege. Thinking themselves above others, they use the vulnerability and pain of those in their charge, as building blocks for their own egos. Wanting to avoid their own vulnerability and low self-esteem, they hide behind their role as priest or bishop, and "bigging themselves up" in order to hide their fear of being ordinary. This often involves knocking others down, while building up their personal pride, rank, and dignity. Their central goal becomes focused on their arrogant selfimage, leading them to display a proud contempt of others. Their emphasis on personal dignity and rank requires them to view others as somehow beneath them.

As they act out in an overbearing manner, their pride consists in exorbitant claims of rank, dignity, estimation, or power, and an exalted sense of worth and importance. This arrogance is centered in egotism, conceit, grandiosity, and a sinful inflation of self-importance. Ancient Greek literature refers to hubris, a form of arrogance in which a person thinks himself to be higher in status than other ordinary mortals, and they think themselves as a sort of god. Their arrogance becomes a way of manipulating others' perceptions of themselves in order to avoid taking a "hit" to their own self-esteem. Their basic strategy is to get others to see them as special, perfect, flawless, and thus diverting attention from their ordinary imperfections, weaknesses and failings, thereby keeping their self-esteem artificially inflated.

The truth is that to be effective in ministry, clergy need to see themselves as least of the brethren, and a servant to others. In being open about their failings and culpability, their own humanness allows them to be true pastors and fathers to their flock. Their own imperfections become the stepping stones for bringing about the healing of those who come to them. Their gentle guidance, and their willingness to be vulnerable as Christ's agents of healing, make them true icons of the Co-Suffering Saviour, who came in the flesh as a simple servant.

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Daily Reflection Seeing Things as They Are "Glory to You, Who has shown us the light!" (Byzantine Matins, Great Doxology)

Indeed, God shows me "the light," specifically His light, to see things as they are, rather than how I might

imagine them to be, when left to my own "lights." On my own, without a God-centered focus, I tend to slip into a distorted vision of things; I begin to see "more" or "less" than there is, in the various realities of my life. For example, I might "see" my financial situation as "less" than it is, when I'm not embracing gratitude. Conversely, I might see "more" than I actually have, and spend unwisely. I can also distort my relationships with people, including myself, burdening them with unrealistic expectations or even demands.

Today let me let God show me His light, setting aside both fear and denial. Because His is a gentle light, which liberates me from confusing and ultimately-hurtful distortions. Let me open up to His grace, re-connecting with Him in some heartfelt prayer and re-focusing (metanoia), which brings me humble acceptance of, and gratitude for, things as they are. "Glory to You, Who has shown us the light!"
